Two of the most powerful and impactful words of the Torah appear in the first paragraph of the Shma: *Veshinantam L'vaneicha*, and you will teach your children, has served as an

admonition from the time of Moses to our day, to give our children the best education possible.

There are few commandments that the Jewish people have taken more seriously than this one. According to the latest Pew Study, with an average of 13.4 years of schooling, Jews are the most highly educated of the world's major religious groups.

What of religious education?

The clear majority of young people who will receive a Jewish education will do so in a religious school program, under the auspices of a synagogue. The importance of this work is immeasurable to help create a sense of community, develop a young person's spiritual life, build a strong Jewish education and foster a deep connection to the State of Israel. Veshinantam L'vaneicha are words we take to heart at Anshe Emet and our Joseph and Belle Braun Religious School. In order to give our young people the best educational experience possible, our LaAtid Task Force crafted a vision of youth and family education based on a robust and meaningful curriculum. Now, in the first year of implementation, we are already seeing the fruits of our labor.

We are proud to announce that the Phillip C. and Beverly Goldstick Family Foundation has made a very generous gift of \$50,000 to Anshe Emet Synagogue to establish the Beverly Goldstick Curriculum for 21st Century Jewish Learning. The purpose of this special

gift is to invest in a curriculum for Conservative Jewish education at Anshe Emet and hopefully to become a nationally useful resource to other Conservative synagogues.

Beverly Goldstick was a loving wife to Phil, an extraordinary mother to Gale and Karen, and a very proud grandmother. Sadly, Beverly died last year. In her life, Beverly possessed a passion for the Jewish people and education. She exemplified the words *Veshinantam L'vaneicha*, and you will teach your children. The Beverly Goldstick Curriculum for 21st Century Jewish Learning will serve as a living legacy for a remarkable woman.

The Jewish Traveler: Shabbat Shalom, Amigo

It's not often you hear, "Shabbat Shalom, amigo," but so it goes in Panama City (top), a thriving, modern city that is home to 15,000 Jews.

While Wendy and I did not travel to Panama in search of Jewish culture, it found us, which was a treat.

After an easy 5-hour direct flight, our first stop was Cosco Viejo, old Panama City. On a lark, I Googled synagogues in Panama and found five. We decided to go to the Ashkenazi Sinagoga Beth El (bottom). It is one of the nicest, most modern, we have ever seen. The people were equally cosmopolitan. Listening to the sermon in Spanish and seeing the

Siddur transliterated in Spanish on the left side of each page reminded me just how universal our Judaism is and was very special.

The modern Orthodox community was most welcoming. I learned that Panama's Jews have little assimilation—most keep kosher, go to Jewish day schools, and do not intermarry—yet they are warmly accepted and successful in Panamanian society. There have even been two Jewish presidents, and some say, there might not be an Israel today without Panama's "Sam the Banana Man" Zemurray. Check out the full story online!

Missy Walny

I converted thirteen years ago at Anshe Emet. Whenever I think of my own unfolding future, and the future of my two boys, Ari and Idan. I think of what it

means to be Jewish. It isn't an accident of birth. It's a choice that we make every day.

The only reason we are here is because, for thousands of years, Jews made the choice to stay Jewish, even when it was impossibly challenging. Some opted out. We are here because of those who opted in. If we take the notion of peoplehood seriously, every choice we make must be made intentionally and with the future in mind. We have to continue to opt in. I am so excited for my boys to see me learning Torah. They will see their mom, a woman and a convert, who practiced for months, engaging with God, Israel, and Torah. My prayer for them will be this: may my choice today inspire their choices for all of their days. Amen.



Iim Honsaker

My decision to convert to Judaism was a process that took over ten years of back and forth discussion and introspection. There were times where I

felt that the decision needed little thought, that it was just my natural progression in life and was where I needed to be. [I had a] fear of how my family would react [to my conversion], how my friends would react, whether I'd be accepted or not. I could fill pages with everything that drove my fear and reluctance for well over a decade.

It was when I first met my now wife that a lot of those fears started to wear away. I finally made it to a point where I was comfortable taking the step that I had been procrastinating on. I met with Cantor Berke in May of 2017 and had an amazing conversation which led to my enrolling in the JBC class through the shul. After going through the program, having my Beit Din, going to the Mikvah, and having my first Aliyah, I felt amazing but I realized that my progress leading up to that point, though great, was really only the very beginning. When the opportunity to join the Gesher program presented itself, it only made sense. This is simply the next step in the infinite amount of steps for me and my life as a Jew to continuously learn and grow in our incredible community.



Sarah Davelaar

I officially joined the Jewish People in the spring of 2015. As I came out of the Mikvah, I was charged with the

responsibility to continue to learn. For we as a people are told in Pirkei Avot to "Turn it, and turn it, for everything is in it." I joined the Gesher class to learn. In particular, I have carried with me some shyness about approaching the Bimah to receive an Aliyah. Gesher has given me the skills so I can complete the mitzvah of receiving an Aliyah with confidence. It's been a joy to learn from Naomi and my classmates.
