

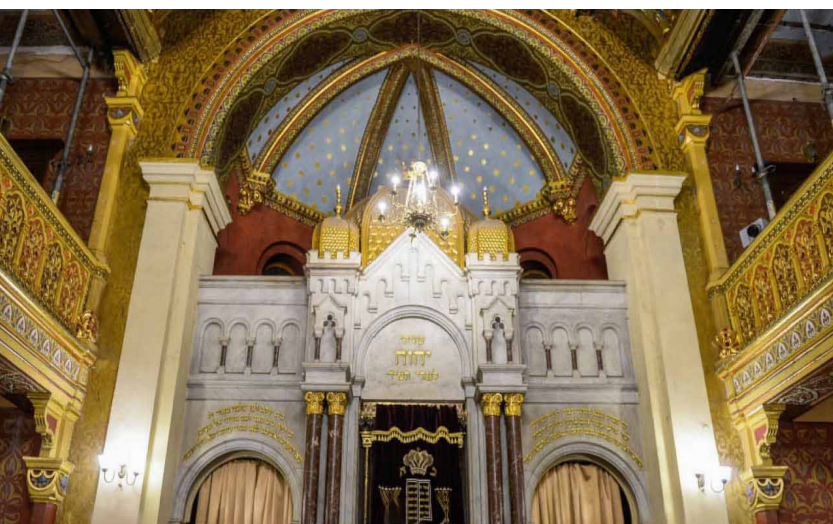

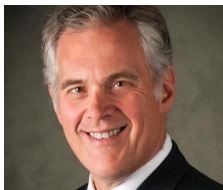

One of the joys of my Rabbinate has been traveling with members of our community across the globe. Aside from seeing remarkable sites and

experiencing our people's history firsthand, there is the added benefit of traveling with your community. As special as it has been for Janet and me to get to know those who have traveled with us, it has also been gratifying to watch people create meaningful friendships that last long after the trip ends. In the

Summer and Fall of 2020 our community will be hosting two unforgettable trips, so please consider coming along.

Our congregation will have the opportunity to join with Rabbi Seth Limmer and members of Sinai Congregation on a trip to Poland from June 14 to the 20. We will walk the streets of Krakow, Lublin and Warsaw, and visit places that were once great Jewish centers of life and learning. Our group will also visit Auschwitz and Birkenau, to reflect on the atrocities that were committed in those places. What makes this trip so special is that our scholar-in-residence will be Rabbi Yehiel Poupko, who serves as Judaic Scholar at the Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Chicago. Rabbi Poupko is one of the great experts on the subject of Eastern European Jewry and the Shoah. He is also a master teacher. Space is limited. We only have 20 places, so please sign up quickly:

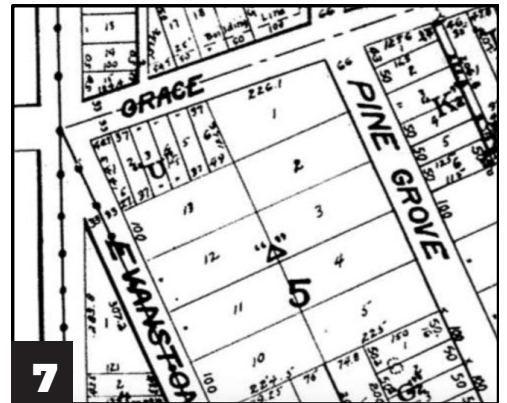
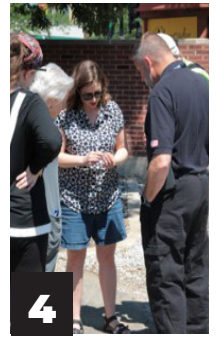
What's in the Safe?

On the opening day of religious school, we got to explore the question on everyone's mind: what's in the Anshe Emet safe? This mysterious safe was found in the parking lot over the summer, while we were digging for the new construction.

I had the chance to learn from an urban archaeologist and a Chicago historian about what this area was like more than a hundred years ago, when we think the safe was first buried. We still don't know what's in the safe, but we can make a better guess now—and the clues we've uncovered do suggest the safe's contents might be interesting enough to be worth the effort of opening.
