Parsha

SHEMINI - Eighth

Leviticus 9:1-11:47

Parashat Sh'mini begins with the first celebration of the sacrifice after the seven days of ordination. This sacrifice on the eighth day marks the first time that the altar is used for a sacrifice on behalf of the people Israel. Moses underscores the purpose of sacrifice when he says, "This is what the Lord has commanded that you do, that the Presence of the Lord may appear to you." Aaron and his sons follow the instructions of Moses, and perform the sacrifices exactly as God has commanded. Then Aaron lifts his hands and blesses the people. God's Presence appears to all the people, and a fire from God consumes the burnt offerings. The people respond by rejoicing and worshipping.

Joy turns to tragedy as Aaron's sons offer alien fire, rather than performing the sacrifices in accordance with God's command. As a result, a fire from God consumes them and they both die instantly. Aaron is silent in the face of God's power and his sons' death, and Moses tells Aaron and his remaining sons not to engage in public displays of mourning. Instead, he instructs the entire community to mourn for the burning. Moses then instructs the priests to refrain from wine or other intoxicants when performing the sacred service. He lays out the role of the priesthood: "You must distinguish between the sacred and the profane, and between the unclean and the clean, and you must teach the Israelites all the laws which the Lord has imparted to them through Moses." The Torah then provides the laws of kashrut (the dietary laws), reflecting the conviction that what and how one eats has spiritual consequence, creates strong communal bonds, and reinforces important religious insights.

The first listed are permitted land animals: those with fully cleft hooves and who chew their cud. Other land animals are prohibited. Of water creatures, the permitted animals are those with both fins and scales. Prohibited birds are listed without any broad principal offered to explain the list. Most winged swarming creatures are prohibited, except for four types of permitted locusts. These form the core of the kashrut system still observed by traditionally religious Jews today.

The reason for these kosher laws is offered by the Torah: "For I the Lord am your God: you shall sanctify yourselves and be holy, for I am holy. For I the Lord am He who brought you up from the land of Egypt to be your God: you shall be holy for I am holy."

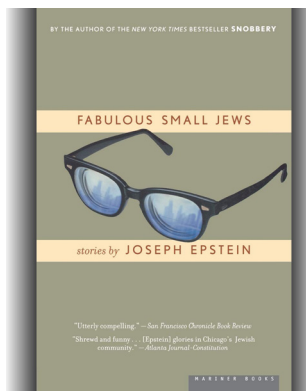

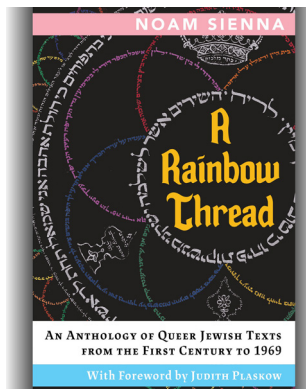
