# Parsha Summaries

## Tzav • Command

*Leviticus 6:1-8:36*

On the surface, Tzav appears to repeat much of the previous parashah. In fact, the first two chapters instruct the priests how to perform the rituals accompanying the sacrifices described in Parashat Vayikra. These chapters focus on the priests as officiants and emphasize the care required to maintain a state of tohorah (purity). A special focus of Tzav is the instruction that a portion of each sacrifice belongs to the priesthood and becomes the core of their sacred meals, eaten within the walls of the sanctuary.

Tzav begins with a discussion of the kodesh kodashim (the most sacred offerings), which are four: the Olah (burnt offering) and the Mincha (grain offering), since both are part of the public ritual; and the Hattat (sin) offering and the Asham (guilt offering), the latter which are not part of the routine public ritual but result from an individual's private penitence.

Afterward, the Torah describes the kodashim kallim, offerings of lesser sanctity. These include the zevah ha-shelamim, peace or whole offering. This was used in private worship, except for the Shelamim of Shavuot.

With chapter 8, the Torah moves on to the Hakhel (gathering) of the entire community and the ordination and consecration of the altar and the priests over the course of seven days. The ordination includes sacrifice, and also the ritual of Moses taking some of the sacrificial blood and smearing it on Aaron's right earlobe, his right thumb, and his right big toe.

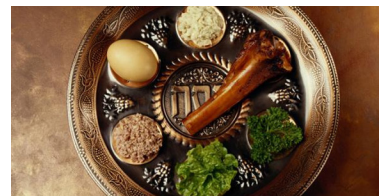

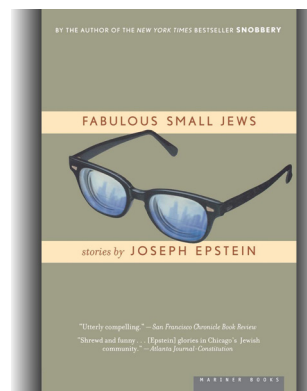


## VIRTUAL HAVDALLAH SERVICE: AESHAVUAH TOV! SATURDAY, APRIL 4 • 8:30PM
