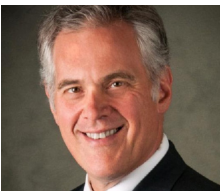

Listen to the Trumpet Sounds of What is Happening Around Us

Recently, I had the privilege of speaking to the graduates of the Bernard Zell Anshe Emet Day School. Like students around the country, these

young people have seen their graduation year upended as their teachers and administrators did everything possible to educate them and celebrate their accomplishments. I share the message that I offered them that day as it speaks to this tumultuous moment in time. At the time of this writing, a pandemic continues in this country as demonstrations continue across our city and country demanding an end to the racism that has plagued this

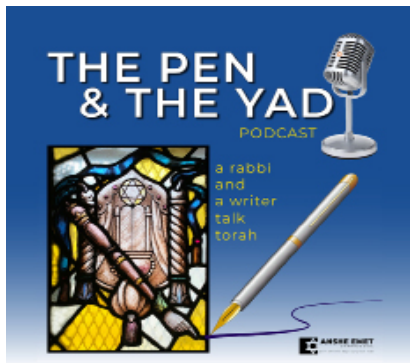
nation since its inception.

In our Torah reading of B'alotcha, Moses is command to make *Hotzotrot Kesef*, two silver trumpets. Each had a specific purpose. One was used to call the community/*Eidah*, together and the other was sounded to instruct the Camp/*Machaneh* to move forward. The Rabbis note that the Torah refers to the Israelites as either an *Eidah* or a *Machaneh* and offers an explanation for the difference in terminology. They explain that one trumpet is used in a time when the entire camp must either begin traveling forward or prepare to defend itself. The impetus for the action comes from the outside, while the other trumpet is a call to community that must come from within. One must feel an attachment to one another to fully hear the call to come together.

As students of the Bernard Zell Anshe Emet Day School, your education has provided you with the modern equivalent of those two silver horns. You have learned that when there is a call for help, you have an obligation to respond. As Elie Wiesel once said so poignantly, *the opposite of faith is not heresy, it is indifference*. We must always be listening to the trumpet sounds of what is happening around us. On this day, we do not need to

listen very hard to hear the call for justice in America today, and our tradition compels us to respond. You have also been taught to listen from within for the call of community

During these years at Bernard Zell, you have had the opportunity to come together as an *Eidah*, and have learned the importance of being present for one another. You have also experienced examples of what can happen when people do not heed the trumpet sound of community. You have been taught to hear and respond to the sound of the horn of *Machaneh*, the needs of the larger society, and to the *Eidah*, your Jewish community, as well. Knowing the people of this graduation class, I am confident that you will be listening and acting!

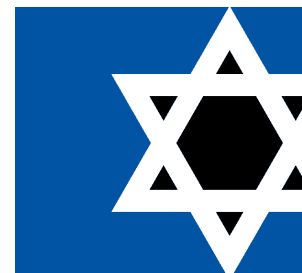
