# Parsha Summary

## Devarim • Words

### Deuteronomy 1:1 - 3:22

The fifth book of the Torah constitutes Moses' farewell address to the people of Israel on the border of Eretz Yisrael. According to Jewish tradition, Moses' series of discourses took thirty-six days to deliver, beginning on the first of Shevat and ending on the sixth of Adar. Deuteronomy is portrayed as the time that "Moses undertook to expound this Teaching (ha-Torah ha-zot)." The purpose of this instruction is to convey law as well as teachings that must be studied and pondered, with the intention of molding character, establishing virtues, and making goodness and holiness habitual.

The first discourse describes the history of Israel from the liberation from Egyptian slavery up to this event some forty years later. The first section of the first speech offers a retrospective and culls important moral lessons for Israel to learn from its first half century. The theme of this section is neatly summarized: "Adonai your God has been with you these past forty years; you have lacked nothing."

Moses uses this opportunity to remind the Israelites of key lessons they will need as they enter Israel: that a lack of trust in God and a lack of obedience to God's will results in calamity, and that, conversely, faith and obedience result in victory. God is the warrior who does battle on Israel's behalf. Moses relates how the disobedience and rebellion of the tribes led to their defeat by the Amorites and the condemnation of the first generation to death in the wilderness, and how the second generation's trust led to military victories over enemy rulers, King Sihon and King Og. The conclusion that Moses derives from Israel's liberation and early wanderings is this: "You have seen with your own eyes all that Adonai your God has done to these two kings; so shall Adonai do to all the kingdoms into which you shall cross over. Do not fear them, for it is Adonai your God who will battle for you."




