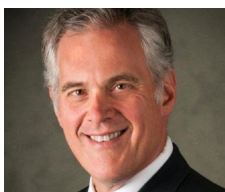

A Difficult Anniversary: A Future Filled with Hope

Anshe Emet Synagogue was founded in 1873 in an apartment on Sedgwick Street. In the nearly 150 years since that first service, our congregation has grown and evolved in ways that the original conveners could have scarcely foreseen. Something else that they could not have imagined was the congregation closing its building for more than a year in the face of a pandemic, much less thriving in the process. But that is what we have witnessed since March of 2020.

There is a beautiful phrase in the Siddur that we repeat each morning:

הַמָּחֲדָשׁ בְּטוֹבוֹ בְּכָל־יוֹם תָּמִיד מְעֻשָּׂה בְּרָאשִׁית
*Day after day in Divine goodness,
God renews the creation.*

The message of our prayer book is clear: the world was not created only once, but is recreated each day. Over the course of the past year, I have deepened my appreciation of these words. Quite remarkably, over the past year Anshe Emet has transformed itself and learned to be a congregation without walls. We have:

- Held online services each week as well as during the High Holy Days
- Created a myriad of children's programs
- Offered outdoor prayer opportunities
- Implemented a wide array of online learning opportunities, social gatherings, and concerts
- Engaged in challenging conversations on the issues of our times
- Held weddings and funerals, baby namings and bris', conversions and B'nai Mitzvah with a combination of in-person and online participation
- "Popped our trunks"
- Facilitated hundreds of meal deliveries and check-in calls

Quite literally, we have recreated Anshe Emet every day over the past year. I am so very proud of our staff for their tireless efforts, their ingenuity, and their passion.

I want to express my gratitude to each of you for your patience and your willingness to go through this challenging year with us. Thank you for responding in such large numbers to our congregational survey. It means the world to the staff and our lay leadership to know how much our efforts resonated with our community.

We are well aware that we did not succeed in every area and there is much work to do. We are enjoying your praise and are working hard to improve based on your criticism.

I pray that we will never again experience a year like the last one, and I am so grateful to be part of a congregation that has met the challenge so admirably and is preparing to walk forward into a new and renewed future. Onward together!

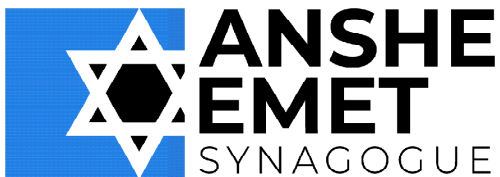
