## Donate to our **Refugee Resettlement Fund**

Dear Friends:

During the early days of the holiday, I was contacted by members of our community regarding the plight of a family from Afghanistan that brings all of these ideas of Sukkot together: vulnerability, faith and inclusivity. I write this email in the hopes that in the spirit of the holiday and the call of our tradition that you will want to help as well.

Jeff Aeder and Jennifer Levine are people of action, and our community is the better for it. Whether it was their vision to create Milt's, a kosher restaurant in Lakeview, or the Wolcott College Prep, Jeff and Jennifer are people who make their dreams, and those of others, into reality. I received this email from Jeff in the opening days of Sukkot:

*Friends:*

*Last March, Wolcott students met a young Afghani student via Zoom. He offered them an insightful window into life in Afghanistan to enrich their reading of the novel The Kite Runner. The Wolcott students and their teacher, Ryan Hurnevich, were bowled over by the young Afghani's candor and poise. He left a tremendous impression.*

*Fast forward six months to a frantic email I received from the Afghani student's teacher at Dwight International On-Line School. She was desperately looking to help him flee Afghanistan. As a member of the Hazara Shia community, he and his family feared immediate persecution from the Taliban. He was also terrified because he and his brother had worked with an NGO that tutored Afghan girls.*

*Seeing what was unfolding in Afghanistan and hearing everybody's praise of this young man, I felt compelled to help. After four weeks of constant communication with the student, his 23-year-old sister who is in graduate school in Staten Island, as well as a wide-ranging number of people including U.S. political figures and a Satmar rabbi, I was able to arrange for the student and his family's escape from Afghanistan. With great relief, they are now in a safe house in Pakistan as we help them figure out next steps — which is no easy task.*

*While the family is in a safe place for the moment, we are working (intently and creatively) to get them to a friendly host country and, ultimately, be reunited with their daughter in the United States. Attached is a video of the family from their room in Pakistan expressing gratitude and relief for their current situation.*

*I am writing simply to let you know that, if you are at all interested, there may be an opportunity for you to help this family and others like them whose lives are now in great danger. Feel free to reach out to me if these efforts resonate with you.*

Note how those ideas inherent to Sukkot resonate in Jeff's words, vulnerability, faith and inclusivity. As in the past, we want to give our Anshe Emet family the opportunity to help in such important, and lifesaving endeavors. On behalf of our entire community I want to thank Jeff and Jennifer for their extraordinary efforts, and for the chance to fulfill the words of our Siddur which contain the essence of Sukkot: U'fros Aleinu Sukkat Shlomecha: Spread over us the Sukkah of your peace. May we be amongst those who extend God's Sukkah of peace and protection. Shabbat Shalom and Chag Sameach!








### SOMETHING FOR US PRESENTS OLIVE OIL TASTING IN THE SUKKAH
