An Opportunity to Reflect on Our Congregation's Musical Past, Present, and Future

On my first Rosh Hashanah at Anshe Emet, I remember walking out of the community hall service at one point and seeing a couple rushing to the Sanctuary. They called out as they went by: "Rabbi, welcome to Anshe Emet. Forgive us but we can't miss Moe's Hineni." Of course, they were referring to Cantor Moses J. Silverman's chanting of one of the liturgical highlights of the service. As those people ran by, I began to appreciate the powerful role that the Cantors of our congregation have played in the spiritual life of this community. For so many, the High Holy Days would not feel complete without hearing their beloved Cantor chanting the sacred words of our liturgy.

Hineni: I am here, I am fully present, I am ready to do your will. These are just a few of the ways that the word Hineni has been translated. The word is emblematic of the extraordinary Cantors that have served our community. How many congregations can say that they have had two of the leading Cantors in the country lead them for nearly 80 years?

It was my privilege to serve with Cantor Silverman in his final years and Hazzan

Mizrahi for more than 30. I have stood on the Bimah and have been witness to the power of the Cantorial art. To observe a congregation being elevated by a magnificent voice interpreting our sacred liturgy has been a truly great privilege. Cantor Silverman and Hazzan Mizrahi brought their remarkable presence and significantly added to the musical repertoire of the Anshe Emet Synagogue.

On Sunday, May 15th, our congregation will install Rachel Brook as our Senior Cantor. History will be made as Cantor Brook becomes the first woman to occupy this position in the nearly 150-year history of Anshe Emet Synagogue. On her first holiday with us last September, Cantor Brook continued a tradition that Hazzan Mizrahi began. Just as he had sung Cantor Silverman's setting of Hineni, she did the same. Since then, Cantor Brook has been fully present for our congregation in so many ways. She has been a presence reimagining our Friday night experience; creating a youth choir to accompany her; and gracing our prayer services with her magnificent voice and the joy of her personality. Every Sunday morning, you can listen to her

leading the students of our religious school in song and prayer. There was an online concert celebrating the music of Stephen Sondheim, and our joyous Purim Spiel, both created by Cantor Brook. Hineni: Cantor Brook has fulfilled all the nuances of that word since coming to Anshe Emet.

At the Installation, Hineni, we will be present to participate in a powerful ritual marking the sacred nature of this moment for our community. We will have the opportunity to celebrate the American Cantorate as Cantor Brook preforms with some of our country's leading Cantors. A new musical composition commissioned for the occasion by one of our leading Jewish composers will be played for the first time. Cantor Brook has also prepared a special tribute to the legacies of Cantor Silverman and Hazzan Mizrahi. In this way, Cantor Rachel Brook will lead the Anshe Emet community in paying homage to our congregation's rich musical past, while celebrating our exciting present and very bright future.

Hineni: Our hope is that our community will be fully present on a truly joyous and historic day.

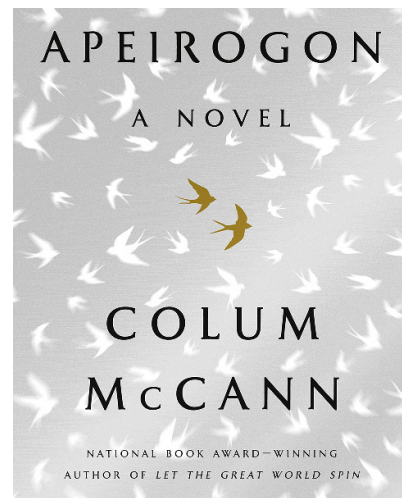

AES Community Announcements



For several years, Rabbi Siegel recognized a growing need in the community for Jewish gravesites within the city. In response, Anshe Emet, through its Endowment Fund, purchased 40 plots at Rosehill Cemetery in 2018. Those plots sold very quickly and with just a few remaining, the Endowment Fund has now purchased a number of additional plots available to congregants to purchase.

Founded in 1859, Rosehill Cemetery is the largest—and one of the older—cemeteries in the city of Chicago. Located in the North Ravenswood neighborhood, the park comprises 350 acres of beautifully manicured grounds that encompasses peaceful lakes, green gardens and decades of history. An architectural wonder, the Rosehill Cemetery Gatehouse dates back to 1864 and was designed by famed architect William Boyington, who also designed the Chicago Water Tower, one of the city's most recognizable historical landmarks. Unfortunately, many of the buildings designed by Boyington were destroyed in the Great Chicago Fire of 1871 and the Gatehouse is one of the few Boyington pre-fire buildings that remain. Tours of the property are available and we encourage you to visit.
