Knocking On Heaven's Door

One of the highlights of the High Holy

Day liturgy is Kol Nidre. That sense of solemnity and seriousness as we call court into session, as our community along with the entirety of the people of Israel reflect on our actions of the past year; as well as the words we have uttered and the vows we have made. The Torah scrolls are brought from the Ark and presented as witnesses for and against the Jewish people. It is the height of Jewish liturgical theatre.

As the Sifrei Torah are taken from the Ark, the congregation is instructed to recite:

*B'Yeshiva Shel Ma-aaleh,
B'Yeshiva Shel Mata*

*By the authority of the court on high
and by the authority of the court below,
With divine consent and with the
consent of this congregation,
We grant permission to pray with
those who have transgressed.*

How do we understand this strange interplay between heaven and earth? We understand the idea of court below, but what is the court on high of which the

Mahzor speaks?

The answer to that question reveals a remarkable concept about the Jewish view of heaven and earth and the human capability to add to the holiness of the higher world or to wreak havoc. The beautiful work of art that graces the cover of our High Holy Day Bulletin is a beautiful reflection of this idea. See how the world below, an artist's rendition of Jerusalem, is reflected in the Temple in the heavens above? The breathtaking idea that our tradition teaches is that our actions on earth resonate above; they have power to recreate the Temple of Old. We normally think in terms of reward and punishment on the holidays, or who will live and who will die. But we do not think in terms of how our actions impact the greater universe, have resonance to the very throne of heaven!

As I write these words, forest fires are ravaging parts of our country and around the world, a significant heat wave is gripping whole swaths of our country and beyond, and devastating floods are impacting people in Missouri and Kentucky. Changes in our climate are having a

disastrous impact on the world and the heavens that surround us.

What we do on earth has an impact, a resonance, well beyond us. The symmetry reflected in the artwork has been affected by the actions of humankind and we are paying a price. Yom Kippur is a reminder of the power that humanity wields in this world, but most importantly, that only human beings recalibrate the relationship between heaven and earth through acts of *Teshuvah*; that is, acts that acknowledge we have gone wrong, and take the steps to create a new path forward. Our tradition is a reminder that these paths created on earth resonate to heaven's door.

Janet and I, along with our entire staff and their families, look forward to welcoming you for the holidays. We are excited to pray together, to study together and prepare for a sweet New Year. One where we find greater balance in all aspects of our lives, both here on earth and in the heavens as well.
