The Power of A Book

Remembering Rabbi Byron Sherwin and Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel

Can a book change the trajectory of your life?

I believe that the answer is yes.

In the fall of 1972, I was a freshman at Hiram College. Had you asked me what my career path was at that time, I would have quickly told you dentistry. I knew what courses were required, and what dental school I wanted to attend. That was before a professor handed me a copy of *The Sabbath*, by Abraham Joshua Heschel. I remember sitting down outside, under a tree on a beautiful fall day, and opening the book, utterly unprepared for its contents. The book begins with this: *He who wants to enter the holiness of the day must first lay down the profanity of clattering commerce, of being yoked to toil. He must go away from the screech of dissonant days, from the nervousness and fury of acquisitiveness and the betrayal in embezzling his own life.*

The inspired words of Abraham Joshua Heschel touched my Jewish soul in a way nothing else had before. Making my way through Heschel's poetic prose, I found myself sitting at the feet of a Jewish spiritual master, his impact on me was profound. The Sabbath as a "Sanctuary in Time", or a concept such as "Eternity Utters

a Day", took on meaning and urgency. When I finished reading the book, I immediately read it again. On that day, I discovered a fire burning in my soul which served as the beginning of a Jewish journey that ultimately led me to the rabbinate.

Can a book change the trajectory of your life?

As I discovered, along with thousands of others who were impacted by the power of Abraham Joshua Heschel's books, the answer is a resounding yes. By the time my spiritual journey led me to the Jewish Theological Seminary, Heschel was no longer alive. He died a few months after I first read *The Sabbath*. Truth be told, I envied those who had the privilege of actually studying with Heschel.

One of the people who did study with Heschel was Dr. Byron Sherwin. A philosopher, theologian, writer, and gifted teacher, Byron taught at the Spertus Institute for many years and shared his creative thinking widely until his death in 2015. A sampling of Byron's works range from the Golem to goodness to the Jewish relationship with the Church; from a theology of Judaism to a mystical view of the Chicago Cubs. Byron also had a special relationship with Anshe Emet. He and his wife Judy met here. Their

wedding was to take place in our congregation, with Rabbi Heschel presiding. Tragically, Heschel died suddenly a few days before the wedding. This year marks the 50th Yahrzeit of Dr. Heschel, and we will honor his memory, as well as that of Dr. Sherwin, in a memorial lecture featuring Rabbi Arthur Green.

A renowned scholar of Jewish mysticism and neo-Hasidic theology, Rabbi Green helped to found Hebrew College, a non-denominational rabbinical school. Rabbi Green was also a student of Rabbi Heschel. On June 12, I will have the privilege of having a Zoom dialogue with Rabbi Green where we will discuss Heschel's mission to recast Hasidism for the contemporary world as well as look deeper into his central notion that God is in need of human beings. Rabbi Green will also share some of his reminiscences of Heschel. I hope that you will join us for what promises to be a powerful evening.

Can a book change the trajectory of your life?

If you have not read Heschel, I encourage you to pick up *The Sabbath* and gauge its impact for yourself.

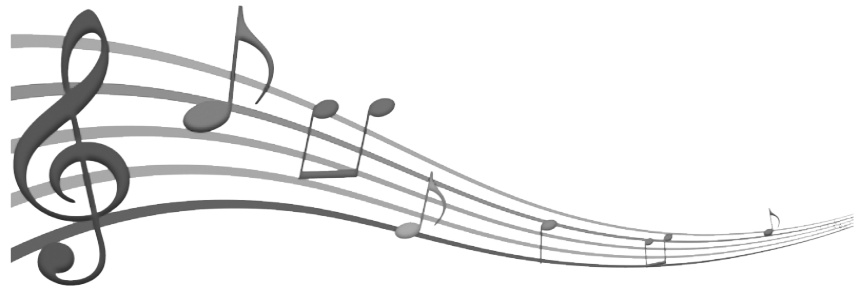

We can't wait to see what else the spring brings and look forward to making music with you soon!

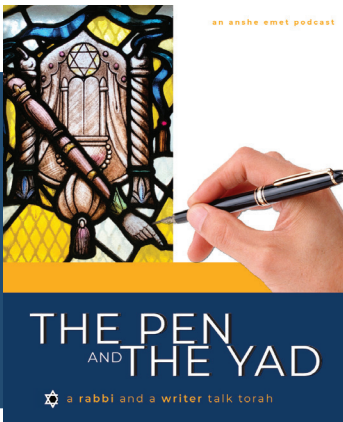
