General Information

This year, Anshe Emet will hold in person services in the following spaces: Main Sanctuary, Blum Community Hall, 4th Floor Bernard Zell Gym (for Malkov Chapel-Style services), and Malkov Chapel (for Minyan Rimón). The Main Sanctuary will also be available for viewing via livestream with closed captioning on the AES website.

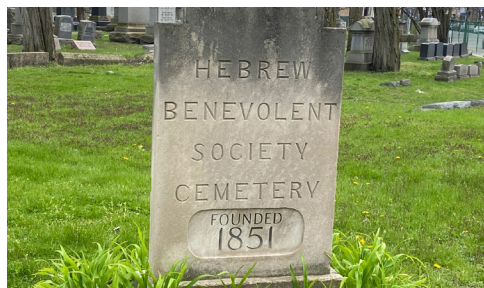


Healing Service with Rabbi D'ror Chankin-Gould and Cantor Liz Berke

Why **Environmental Justice**?

There is a classic Midrash from Ecclesiastes that describes the time when God created Adam. God led him around the Garden of Eden and said: "Look at My works! How beautiful and praiseworthy they are. Everything that I have created, I created for you. Take care not to damage and destroy My world, for if you destroy it, there is no one to repair it after you." (*Midrash Kohelet Rabbah* 7:13)

KINDERGARTEN AND YOUNGER:

Babysitting will be available on both days of Rosh Hashanah and on Yom Kippur. Childcare is provided by Jovie of Chicago. Storytellers and musicians will visit the classrooms. Lunch will be provided all three days. You must register your children and sign them in and out.

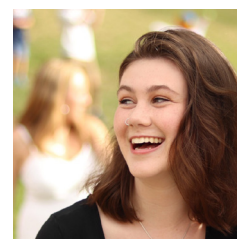

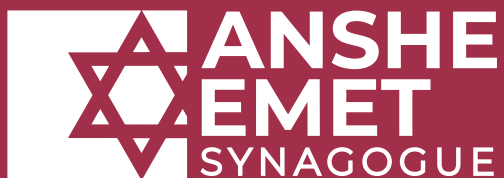
