CAUSING THE LIGHT OF THE HANUKKIAH TO GROW EACH DAY:

KINDLING THE LIGHT OF THE JEWISH SPIRIT WITH SARAH HURWITZ

Sometimes an ancient debate can uncover very timely and relevant truths.

While Hanukkah is well established in our Jewish calendar, historically it is our latest holiday. The Festival of Lights is post-Biblical and takes place in Fall of 164 B.C.E. As a result, the way we observe the holiday was still being debated one hundred years later. In a famous debate, Hillel argues that one should begin with one candle and add one more each night, while Shammai advocates for beginning with eight candles on the first night and reducing the numbers afterwards. Hillel reasons that Jews should always increase holiness and never decrease. Hence, to this day, Jews follow the approach of Hillel and create more light as the days of Hanukkah go on.

I have come to believe that Jews have an internal Hanukkiah within them. Over the course of my Rabbinate, I have marveled at how that light of Jewish identity, meaning, spirituality and engagement can be ignited and increased. I can speak about this phenomenon personally, as it was not until college that Judaism became fully meaningful to me. It is a source of great inspiration to see the numbers of Jews who increased that very Jewish light in these challenging times since October 7.

A very special Hanukkah gift to our community will be the visit of Sarah Hurwitz. Her story aligns with this idea of finding that internal Hanukkiah of the spirit and then increasing its light. Sarah is a very accomplished person, having served as former First Lady Michelle Obama's speech writer. Over the years, she has found greater depth and meaning in all aspects of her Judaism and has written about her journey in a very compelling way. She wrote about that experience in her first book, Here All Along, which we were privileged to discuss with her a few years ago

when Sarah visited Anshe Emet. Her new book is entitled: As a Jew: Reclaiming Our Story from Those Who Blame, Shame, and Try to Erase Us. In this book, Sarah is going beyond what it takes to grow that Jewish flame, focusing on how to strengthen it against those who seek to douse it in their criticisms of Judaism, Israel, or our people. In short, Sarah is advocating that Jews not allow others to define what Judaism is or is not, but rather see it is as a call to discover it for ourselves.

Appropriately, Sarah will join us during one of the nights of Hanukkah on Tuesday, December 16 at 7PM. If you have high school students, or college students who are home for winter break, please encourage them to join us for a powerful conversation about being a Jew today. Sarah has not only made herself familiar with Hillel's teaching regarding the Hanukkiah, she has put his words into practice in her own life. Through her books, Sarah has been involved in ma'alin bakodesh, increasing the light of this ancient and yet thoroughly modern Jewish flame.

Please join us on December 16 at 7PM, either in person or via livestream.
