GIVING OUR ATTENTION TO THE CHILD WHO DOES NOT KNOW HOW TO ASK: A VITAL TASK FOR OUR TIME

One of the highlights of our Passover Seder is a discussion regarding the Four Children. We examine the different types of children that the Rabbis present: Wise, Wicked, Simple, and the One Who Does Not Know How to Ask. In our home, and I suspect in many others, the discussion focuses on the *Rasha*, the Wicked Son. We delve into questions as to what makes the wise child wise and the wicked son wicked, and whether those approaches work today. Artwork from the Haggadah is presented in support of different positions.

Our focus on the *Rasha* is understandable in that the Rabbis accuse this child of separating from the community and denying our core beliefs. According to the presentation of the Haggadah, the so-called, "wicked child" is most on the edge of the Jewish community—most in danger of stepping away from the Jewish people and their heritage. However, my experience over the last four decades brings me to a different conclusion. It is the fourth child named in the Haggadah, the "one who does not know how to ask", that should garner our attention today. Unlike the *Rasha*, this child does not care enough to ask, or to challenge, and as a result they are the most endangered segment of the Jewish community today. We have a different name for them in our age: nones. These are Jews who identify as having no religion—describing themselves as atheist, agnostic, or "nothing in particular" when filling out a questionnaire. Interestingly, they often retain a Jewish cultural or ethnic identity.

"Nones" are presently the fastest growing population in the Jewish community. According to a survey done in 2020, Jewish "Nones" make up about 40% of young American Jews (under 40) who identify as having no religion. Rather than focus on the *Rasha*, the loudest of the four children, we would do well to give greater consideration to the quiet ones who do not know how to formulate the question and are not even sure that the question is worth asking!

What answer do we offer to those who are not bothering to ask the question?

Here, I believe the Haggadah offers us deep wisdom:

וְשֵׂאִינוּ יוֹדְעַ לְשֹׂאֵל – אֵת פֶּתַח לוֹ,
שֶׁנֶּאֱמַר, וְהִגַּדְתָּ לְבִנְךָ בַּיּוֹם הַהוּא לֵאמֹר,
בְּעִבּוֹר זֶה עָשָׂה יְיָ לִי בְּצֵאתִי מִמִּצְרָיִם.

And the
ONE WHO DOES NOT KNOW HOW TO ASK:
you must open [the story] for him,
as it is said:
"And you shall tell your child

on that day,
'Because of this the LORD acted for me
when I came out of Egypt.'

What is the significance of the words, פֶּתַח לוֹ open for him. Note that the Haggadah does not prescribe offering a preformulated answer. Rather, it instructs us to simply open with the Jewish story. That is the story of a people whose God brought them out of Egypt. It is a story that began with that timeless call to Abraham, which our people continue to respond to today. Rather than instruct this child as to what they "must" believe, we are instructed to present our story and allow them to engage it on their terms, to discover the meaning of Jewish peoplehood and destiny for themselves. I can personally speak to the wisdom of this approach after my more than 40-year journey as a congregational Rabbi.

The great Chasidic Master, Rabbi Menachem Mendel of Kotzk, once noted that in the *V'Ahavta* paragraph of the *Shmah* we say, "These words shall be on your heart, *al levavcha*." Why, the Kotzker Rebbe asked, does the Torah not say "lay these words in your heart?" The heart is not always open. Therefore, the Torah says: "Lay these words on your heart, so that when your heart opens, they will be there, ready to fall in."

On Passover, we gather to tell the remarkable story of the Jewish people where God acted in history and a people courageously responded. It is that story that, despite the many challenges that we have faced, we continue to tell today in no less miraculous ways. Our children of every age deserve to know that story, most especially those who are not asking questions. Rather than lecturing them, it is best for us to lay the story on their hearts in a way that feels honest, compelling, and inspiring. Jewish education at its best opens us up to the miracle of existence and God's role and presence throughout our history. It is to make the words of the Haggadah a powerful reality for the full spectrum of Jewish children and to open our hearts to the powerful reality of the Jewish story.






